Sir William Mallory of Studley and Hutton (Sir John¹⁶, Sir William¹⁷, Sir John¹⁸, Sir William,III¹⁹ Sir William²⁰, William²¹, Sir Christopher²², Sir Thomas²³, Sir Williamw²⁴, Sir Richard²⁵,William²⁶, Henry²⁷, Anketil²⁸, Richar²⁹, Geoffrey³⁰, Anschetil³¹, Goisfrid³², Durand³³) was born ca 1498 in Ripon, North Yorkshire, England, died April 27, 1547 in Studley, Yorkshire, England.

The Inquisition Post Mortem of Sir William Mallory is dated of 'xxiiii die September' (24th September) in the first year of the reign of 'Edward sexti' (1547), confirming that Sir William Mallory died not long before. The document states it is the 'post mortem Willi[am] Malore Militis (Knight)' and then list of lands and estates in 'Studley', 'Grantley and Wynkesley' and later 'Northallerton', 'Rippon' and 'Nunwyke' (now Nunwick), all in North Yorkshire. Nunwick is located very near to Norton-Conyers, the birthplace of Sir John Norton, Sir William Mallory's father-in-law. As these towns were named after the large families of the area, it may be interesting to trace the relationship (possibility through marriage) between the Mallory, Norton, and Nunwyke families. The name of 'Anne Malore' is then mentioned in the Inquisition, though the surrounding words are heavily abbreviated making it difficult to decipher her precise relationship with the words that follow her name: 'Malore Militis defunct' (Mallory, Knight, the deceased). It is likely that she was his daughter. The name of 'Will Malore' is also repeatedly noted, followed by the word 'fil', confirming that he was the son of Sir William Mallory. The date of Sir William's death is not stated until the penultimate line of the Inquisition: 'Will Malorye...obiit xxvii die Aprilis' (died on the 27th day of April) in the first year of the reign of Edward VI (1547). The document also confirms that 'Cristofore Malorye' was named 'fil et heres' (son and heir) of Sir William Mallory, at the age of 'xxii'. This indicates that Christopher Mallory was born in 1525.

Andrew Reade was interred July 8, 1623 in Faccombe, Hampshire, England. Alice died March 6, 1605 in Faccombe, Hampshire, England.

Sir Thomas Windebank (Sir Richard¹⁶, John¹⁷) was born in Haines Hall, Berkshire, England January, 1538, died October 24, 1607 in Scrivelsby, Lincolnshire, England. His body was interred November 25, 1607 in St. Martin, Westminster, London, England.

Sir Thomas Windebank was Clerk of the Signet & Deputy Clerk of the Privy Council. Born at Haines, Hillhurst Parish, Berkshire, England. He was invested as a Knight on 23 July 1603. "He owed his fortunes largely to his Lincolnshire neighbor, Sir William Cecil, who secured his appointment to the fourth stall in Worcester Cathedral in 1569 and sent him, as a travelling companion, to his son, Thomas (afterwards Earl of Exeter). Many of Windebank's letters, describing his vain efforts to keep his charge straight and teach him French, and their travels in France and Germany during 1571 and 1572, are extant in the Public Record Office. He also took every opportunity of sending his patron lemon trees, myrtle trees and tracts on canon and civil law."

After his return, he was made clerk of the signet, and occasionally acted as clerk of the Privy Council. He continued his friendly relations and correspondence with Lord Burghley until the latter's death and, afterwards, with Sir Robert Cecil.

He was knighted by James I on 23rd July 1603, settled at Haines Hill in St. Nicholas Hurst (Berkshire) and died on 24th October 1607. He married Frances, younger daughter of Sir Edward Dymoke of Scrivelsby in Lincolnshire, by whom he left one son, Sir Francis, and three daughters. Of the latter, Mildred (d. 1630) married Robert Reade of Linkenholt near Andover in Hampshire, and was 3x great grandmother of President George Washington.

Sir Thomas Windebank married Lady Frances

Dymoke (Sir Edward¹⁶, Sir Robert¹⁷, Sir Thomas¹⁸, Sir Phillip¹⁹, Sir Thomas²⁰, Sir John²¹, Sir John²², Sir Henry²³, Nicholas de Dimmoch²⁴) born in Scrivelsby, Lincolnshire, England 1545, died between 1612 and 1613 in Hillhurst Prish, Berkshire, England.

Humphrey Stafford (Humphrey¹⁶, Richard¹⁷, John de Stafford¹⁸, John¹⁹, John²⁰, Rodger²¹, Richard²², Rodger²³, Richard²⁴, Richard²⁵) from Eyam County, Derby was born between 1519 and 1541 in Blatherwich, Northamptonshire, England.

The family accumulated vast wealth, and the hundreds of acres they owned included the townships of Eyam, Foolow, and the hamlet of Bretton, besides which they were lords and sole owners of the manors of Calver and Rowland. When the last male descendant, Humphrey, died in 1560, he left a fortune of nearly £1,000,000 to be divided at the death of his wife, Ann, between their four daughters - Alice, Gertrude, Katherine and Ann. Alice married John Savage, of Castleton; Gertrude was married to Rowland Eyre, of Hassop; Katherine became the wife of Rowland Morewood, of Bradfield; and Ann married Francis Bradshaw, of Bradshaw Hall, Derbyshire.

Humphrey Stafford married Lucy Anne Eyre

Robert Kerridge (William III¹⁶, William II¹⁷, William I¹⁸, John⁹) born 1505 in Saxtead, Suffolk, England, died April 13, 1578 in Bedfield, Suffolk, England. Robert Kerrich was born in Suffolk, England, about 1505. His father left him a dwelling in Saxsted and land in Saxsted, Framlingham, Earl-Soham and Monk-Soham, Suffolk. The name of his wife is not known. They had four sons and a daughter. His will is very long, dealing with dwellings and land that he owned, showing that he belonged to the highest class of yeomen. He died between January and April of 1578 in Bedfield, Suffolk, England. He was buried in the churchyard of St. Nicholas' Church there.

Rev. Dr. Edward Pendleton (Thomas¹⁶, Henry¹⁷, Thomas¹⁸) born 1525 in Eccles, Lancashire, England, died 1576 in Eccles. He matriculated at Oxford in 1547-48. He was a very flexible clergyman. First a Catholic, he became a Protestant upon the accession of King Edward VI, but switched back under the Catholic rulers, Philip and Mary, who gave him a vicarage at Eccles, near Manchester. Under Queen Elizabeth he again became a Protestant. He was called by a person named Wood "the famous schoolmaster of Manchester, in Lancashire, who was admitted at Oxford to the reading of any book of the Faculty of Grammar, and to the degree of Bachelor ofGrammar, being incorporated of Oxford in 1547.
