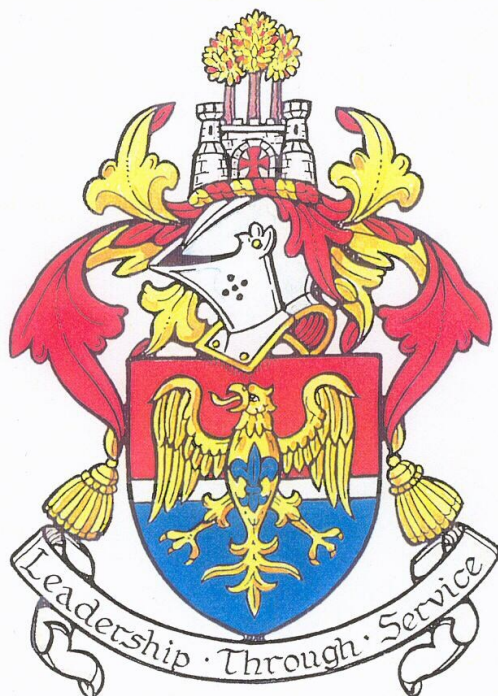




The American College of Heraldry

A Registration of the Armorial Bearings of Wilhelm August Heineman



Be it by these presents known that a Petition hath been submitted unto Representatives of the College requesting that Armorial Bearing appertaining unto the aforementioned Armiger be Recognized and Registered. The President, acting under the authority of the Board of Governors, duly surveyed the Petition and the Armorial Bearings presented, and deemed all things to be in order and accurately represented.

It is, therefore, with pleasure that We Recognize the Arms being rightfully borne and displayed by the Armiger and do enter them in Our Archives and Records under Registration Number 1778, the said Arms being Blazoned to wit:

Per fesse Gules and Azure a barrulet Argent, over-all an eagle displayed wings inverted Or, charged on the breast with a fleur-de-lis Azure. Above the Shield is placed a Helmet with a Mantling Gules doubled Or, and on a Wreath Or and Gules is set for Crest, a castle with two towers Argent the port occupied by a cross formy throughout Gules, and issuing thereabove three trees in Autumn tinctures Proper, and in an Escrol below the Shield this Motto: "Leadership Through Service,"

*Those descendants also Registered to rightfully bear the Arms include:
Lucille Ann Dodson, née Heineman (1779); Peter Edward Heineman (1780);
Sharon Lee Roberts, née Heineman (1781); Bin August Heineman (1782);
Peter Lea Heineman (1783); and Chad August Heineman (1784).*

To provide testimony of these proceedings, this Document hath been executed and the President hath hereunto set his hand and Arms and affixed the seal of the College this day before Almighty God and this Society of Armigers.
